Scope of Physiotherapy

Area

Role

Intensive Care Unit (ICU)

Physiotherapists are an integral part of the multi-disciplinary team in critical care and are uniquely $_{\mbox{\scriptsize qualified}}$ with skills and expertise to work with the assessment and management of respiratory complications, physical deconditioning, and neuromuscular and musculoskeletal conditions.

Pediatric Physiotherapy

Pediatric Physiotherapy is the treatment of children who have developmental dysfunctions and specific pediatric disorders. The therapy also aims to optimize a child's function as they grow, irrespective of their physical condition. It takes into consideration the impact of growth and growth spurts on the child and uses this knowledge to treat each child accordingly.

Neurological Physiotherapy

Neurological Physiotherapy is focused on working with individuals who have a neurological disorder or disease. These include Alzheimer's disease, brain injury, Cerebral Palsy, Multiple Sclerosis, Parkinson's disease, spinal cord injury, and stroke.

Geriatric Physiotherapy

Geriatric Physiotherapy covers a wide area concerning older adults. Many conditions affect people as they grow older such as Arthritis, Osteoporosis, Alzheimer's disease, hip, and other joint replacements, balance disorders, incontinence, etc.

Role

Spine and Back Problems

Physiotherapy can help by decreasing the spasm of the musculature of the spine. Physical therapy can also help to improve posture and decrease mechanical back pain.

Amputee Rehabilitation

The Amputee Physiotherapy service provides specialized rehabilitation for patients following the loss of a limb.

Burns and Plastics

Physiotherapists work very closely with other teams to rehabilitate patients who require skin grafts, flaps, breast reconstructions and other forms of plastic surgery.

Pulmonary Rehabilitation

Physiotherapy services provide assistance to Pulmonary
Rehabilitation patients with Chronic Lung Diseases to improve
their functional capacity and quality of life.

Palliative Care

Physiotherapy in the field of oncology and palliative care plays an important role in both malignant and Non-malignant cases. Physiotherapy optimizes their quality of life and increases their life expectancy.

Women's Health Physiotherapy

The women's health physiotherapy team provides an extensive in-patient and out-patient service to obstetrics and gynecology patients. This includes a series of antenatal classes, pelvic floor muscles exercises, treatment for pregnancy-induced discomforts such as low back pain, symphysis pubis dysfunction, carpal tunnel syndrome and sacroiliac joint dysfunction.

Application fee charges are Rs 2,800. Fee can be submitted in any HBL branch.

- Every applicant will be issued with a unique challan number which will be generated after the candidates submit their CNIC or phone number in the online portal. System will generate unique challan number.
- **2.** Candidate should submit the mentioned fee on challan to any HBL branch.
- **3.** Application needs to upload the image of paid fee challan on the portal.
- **4.** After verification of documents system will generate admit cards.
- **5.** Candidates with incomplete forms, attached unpaid fee or not meeting admission

criteria will not be issued admit cards.

6. The decision of the admission committee will be final.

7. Enrolment, Examination, Certification, Degree Convocation and Documents verification all fees to be paid by the candidate as per JSMU rules.

8. Management can change fee charges without any notice.

Admission Requirements:

Eligibility Criteria: 12 years of education, intermediate (pre – medical)

or A- level with at least 60% marks

Age limit: 17-22 years on admission

Interview: Final dates for the interview to be sent via email

Merit formula: SSC & HSSC (or equivalent): 40%,

Entry Test: 40% Interview 20%.

Entry test:

1. All candidate applying will have to appear in the written one correct multiple-choice question-based entrance test.

- 2. Candidate must score 60% marks to be selected for the final interview by the selection committee.
- 3. Entry test will be based on A Level/Intermediate or equivalent.
- Entry test curriculum/course content will be from following subjects.
 Biology, Physics, Chemistry, English, General knowledge & Analytical questions.

Final decision: Admission decision to be made after a final decision by the admission committee

Documents to be submitted:

Application for admission to the course must be submitted online, available at IUHS website www.iuhs.org.pk

(Online portal link) along with the following documents:

- 1. Intermediate certificate or its equivalent from a recognized board/institute.
- 2. Marks certificate of intermediate or its equivalent.
- 3. Matriculation certificate.
- 4. Recent passport size photograph.
- 5. Domicile and permanent residence certificate issued by a competent Authority (for Pakistani nationals).
- 6. Computerized National Identity Card (for Pakistani nationals).

Other instructions:

- Admission to the university will only be confirmed after the confirmation of the authenticity of the documents.
- No residence or accommodation will be provided.
- Original documents must be provided at the time of submission of the admission fee.
- Tuition fee of every semester is payable in advance.
- Caution money is refundable after completion of program or on cessation of registration after clearance from the current department.
- Any discrepancy found in documents will automatically cancel the admission.
- Degree will be awarded by Jinnah Sindh Medical University at the end of the program

Academic Supporting Services:

Skills Lab:

To make training more effective and sustainable, the Skills Lab is well-equipped with basic and advanced manikins and apparatus to give students hands-on learning experience and develop competencies according to healthcare professional standards.

Kinesiology Lab:

It consists of therapeutic exercise equipment such as an electronic treadmill, elliptical and recumbent bike for aerobic activities, parallel bar and staircase, exercise balls, wheelchairs, and electrotherapy apparatus to meet the students' needs.

Physiology Lab:

The physiology laboratory is well equipped and able to conduct various teaching demonstrations and scientific research studies and has all major equipment in the lab.

Digital Library/Computer Lab:

At Indus College of Physical Therapy & Rehabilitation, teaching is not limited to just "listening and learning," students are provided with opportunities to explore, practice and learn, in a well-equipped digital library. Students can easily get access to the digital lab based on the institute's ID card.

Library:

Library is available in college which possess, all the latest edition with reference book It is very helpful for group study & Self-directed studies.

Lecture Halls:

Lecture halls are equipped with comfortable seating, multimedia, etc.

Student Professional Conduct:

- 1. The college will have a disciplinary committee to deal with all disciplinary matters.
- 2. The disciplinary committee of the college is empowered to take any disciplinary action on a case reported by the Principal /Director of the respective institute.
- 3. Any student whose name appears in the F.I.R pertaining to any non-bailable offense as specified to the criminal procedure code will be suspended. During the tendency of the case, he/she will not be allowed to attend classes or take up any examination.
- 4. The action for situation warranting suspension, rustication or expulsion will be according to the specified procedures as follows:
- **a.** The principal may initiate action against any student of the college and recommend the case to the disciplinary committee for suspension rustication or expulsion, as the case may be.
- **b.** Before taking any action, the principal shall serve a show cause to the student indicating the charges against him/her. The concerned student will have to submit a written response within seven days, after which action will be finalized by the disciplinary committee. The student will be entitled to a personal hearing after this.

General Performance Conduct:

- Attendance in lectures is compulsory. Students with less than 80% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the university examination. All absences from lectures or practical/labs must be accounted for by guardians/parents.
- 2. No student shall from a political/religious society/association/organization.
- 3. No outside person will be invited by the students to address any meeting of the college.
- 4. No student union will be formed without the permission of the principal of the college.
- 5. Students are required to maintain a neat professional appearance and all educational activities (lab coats are mandatory).
- 6. Any student found without a lab coat will be charged with a fine.
- 7. Any student who does not meet the program standards may be dismissed or disciplinary action will be taken.
- 8. The principal can issue disciplinary orders from time to time of permanent or temporary nature for regulating the conduct of the students within the college.
- 9. Students will not be permitted to do any private practice or job; such cases will be reported to the disciplinary committee.
- 10. If any student wants to publish his/her scientific or literary article, he/she must get it approved by the principal. He/she is also required to submit a copy of the draft for record purposes.
- 11. Students will not be allowed to address the national press on the following subjects:
 - a. Political or allied subjects.
 - b. Matters directly or indirectly connected with the administration of the college.
- 12. Students are forbidden to address higher authorities directly. Any communication intended for authorities needs to be enrooted through the principal.
- 13. Smoking and other activities prejudicial to the conduct of the college are prohibited.
- 14. Students must follow the dress code policy of the college.

A. Suspension

A student shall be liable for suspension up to six months if he/she commits any of the following acts:

- 1. Using unfair means during examination. Further action against him/her will be taken by the committee for breach of the rules and regulation. He /she will not be allowed to appear in the remaining examination till the final decision by the committee.
- 2. Misbehavior with any teacher or member of the staff.
- 3. Is found to be disobedient.
- 4. Spreads false rumors.
- 5. Uses unbecoming, indecent, or filthy language.
- 6. Incites other students to violence.
- 7. Violation of dress code.
- 8. Shouts, abuses, quarrels, or fights with fellow students.
- 9. Raises slogans to hurt others, politically or religiously.
- 10. Interferes with the administration, including the mode or schedule of examination.
- 11. Indulges in act of immorality.
- 12. Indulges in any kind of political activity including displaying posters or within the college.
- 13. Remains absent continuously for more than three weeks without prior permission

B. Rustication

A students may be rusticated by the disciplinary committee of the college for three years due to any of the following acts:

- 1. Taking forceful possession, making unauthorized use, or damaging any property.
- 2. Involving himself in any agitational activity.
- 3. Found indulging in activities, prejudicial and detrimental to the good order of the college.
- 4. Adopting unfair means during examination.
- 5. Disobeying an order of suspension passed against him/her.
- 6. Any other act, which the principal or the disciplinary committee considers inappropriate.

*Note

Any student suspended or rusticated for the reasons mentioned above shall not be allowed to appear in the examination.
