PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BS-N): In line with Pakistan Nursing and Midwifery Council (PNMC), candidates may apply for the four-year BScN Programme if their age is within 14 years to 35 years on January 1, 2025. Marital status is not a consideration.

Candidates applying to the BScN programmes should have completed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (HSSC) in the pre-medical group with a minimum of 50% or equivalent with biology, chemistry and physics. Candidates should have completed the Secondary School Certificate (SSC) or equivalent in the Science group with biology, chemistry and physics as compulsory subjects.

Community Midwifery (2-year diploma program)

Pakistan has one of the highest maternal mortality ratios in South East Asia. According to the available statistics over 80% of women deliver at home in Pakistan. Trained health professionals conduct 5% of these deliveries, the rest are delivered by a female who could be a Dai, a traditional birth attendant, a family member or a neighbor. Internationally accepted figures state that 85% of all births can be handled or conducted safely by properly trained midwives. Only 15% of women will develop complications requiring a higher level of professional skills. Most countries of the world have lowered their maternal mortality through the wider involvement the professional midwives.

Performance of the students in the examination shall be assessed on the basis of marks obtained from a total of 100 marks in each course. The marks obtained, shall be presented as Numerical Grade (N.G) and Alphabetical Grade (A.G) as explained below: Assessment of performance on the basis of marks out of 100 fixed for a course recommended in course outlines of different disciplines will be termed as Numerical Grade (NG). Equivalent of numerical grade in terms of alphabets shall be termed as Alphabetical Grades (AG) and each letter carries a value in terms of numerical points termed as Grade Point Average (GPA).
